

Sport Funding at Eastcombe Primary School 2015-16

What is Sport Funding?

The Government provides additional funding for physical education (PE) and sport in schools. This funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision resulting in increased numbers of pupils developing healthy life styles, raising their performance levels and engaging in PE and sport.

Plans for Sport Funding

For the 2015-16 academic year, Eastcombe Primary School has received £4836 of government funding for PE and school sport with the aim of: improving the provision for PE and sport; raising the standards in teaching and learning and developing the physical fitness and well-being of pupils. The final designated amount of Sports Funding will be £8,290.

£236	Cost of hiring the Village Hall and Scout Hut.	<p>Purpose: To ensure children can access the full curriculum and take PE lessons.</p> <p>Outcome: Children will access the full curriculum and take PE lessons indoors. Children will be given the opportunity to improve their skills.</p>
£480	Subsidising cost of residential school trip.	<p>Purpose: To enable children to take part in adventure sports. To increase the range of sports children are exposed to.</p> <p>Outcome: The residential trip is more affordable for all pupils and children are more likely to take part in adventurous sports after the experience.</p>
£2400	KS1 & KS2 day trip to Croft Farm - sailing, abseiling, climbing, canoeing, fencing, archery.	<p>Purpose: To enable children to take part in adventure sports. To increase the range of sports children are exposed to. To enhance our 'Olympic' topic and enable children to experience Olympic Sports.</p> <p>Outcome: Children are more likely to take part in adventurous sports after the experience. Children's awareness of Olympic sports is heightened. Topic taught in school was more purposeful and exciting. Children inspired to become future Olympians.</p>
£210	Tennis Lessons	<p>Purpose: To increase the range of sports children are exposed to. For children to develop co-ordination, balance, and stamina.</p> <p>Outcome: Children will develop their technique, control, balance, co-ordination and rhythm.</p>
£260	Coach Hire	<p>Purpose: To enable pupils to attend sporting events.</p> <p>Outcome: Children will be able to attend local sporting events and compete against Stroud Schools, fostering a love of team sports and a competitive edge to their learning.</p>
£1995	REAL PE - scheme, training and assessment.	<p>Purpose: To enable the children to be taught PE using a scheme enabling full curriculum coverage, assessment opportunities and staff training.</p> <p>Outcome: The new scheme teaches the PE National Curriculum with skills and games as a focus. The children are now taught a progressive curriculum which is year group and key stage appropriate.</p>

£707	Outdoor Equipment to support Physical Development in the Early Years.	<p>Purpose: To increase the opportunities for outdoor PE, Physical Development and gross motor skills to be taught, specifically in the EYFS. Resources will enable the children to be active outside.</p> <p>Outcome: Pupils will develop gross motor skills, balance, fitness, movement and agility outside. This enhances the PE and EYFS curriculum. Pupils will be more active learners and the Foundation Stage Profile should reflect these new opportunities.</p>
£150	Subscription to sports event - Kick Off Stroud	<p>Purpose: To enable the pupils to attend competitive sporting events and also try sports that we do not offer at Eastcombe Primary School</p> <p>Outcome: Children will be able to attend local sporting events and compete against Stroud Schools, fostering a love of team sports and a competitive edge to their learning.</p>
